Job Training Goes Mobile in Region 9

The US Department of Labor Employment and Training Administration (DOL/ETA) recently announced that they would be awarding a \$4,937,950 grant to the Department of Postsecondary Education (DPE.) This job training grant will have a direct impact on the Region 9 area. Community colleges in Region 9 have teamed together to establish a specific requirement for Industrial Engineering Technology skills that would be necessary for employment in the region. One of the main goals of this grant will be to create mobile units for training programs in areas including, but not limited to hydraulics and motor controls. Goals are set and construction is underway to create five mobile labs that will be accessible by community colleges throughout Region 9.
